all about our eResources!

early all of us have our smartphones with us at all times, which means we could have a book with us at all times as well! Download one (or more!) of our eReading apps - Hoopla, CloudLibrary, and Libby - and have a book to read or listen to within minutes. Not sure what app to download? Have questions about how eResources work? Can't find the title you're looking for? Library Director John Howard is here to answer some of our most frequently asked questions regarding our eReading apps.

Q: What are the main differences between the eReading apps?

A: CloudLibrary and Libby (by Overdrive) are pretty similar. Both offer eBooks and eAudiobooks to check out and download. Both have most of the current bestsellers, but you usually have to wait some time for a copy to come available. Hoopla is a bit different. Anything on Hoopla can be checked out immediately, with each person getting 5 checkouts per month. It also includes movies, TV, and comic books, along with eBooks and eAudiobooks. But it has fewer of the most recent bestsellers. I use all three, depending on what I am looking for.

Q: Why do I have to wait so long for my eBook/audiobook?

A: Publishers charge a MUCH higher price to libraries than they do to consumers. Let's use the new John Grisham book, The Exchange, as an example. You can buy the hardcover for \$18.99, or the kindle version for \$14.99, and you own them. The Library has to pay \$55.00 per eBook copy, and the copy disappears after two years. And that copy can only be downloaded by one person at a time. For the eAudiobook of the same title, the Library would pay \$95.00 for a permanent copy or \$47.50 for just 12 months. With these prices, we provide as many copies as we can, but we just can't afford to buy multiple copies. (The newest James Patterson eBook is \$75 for 24 months!)

O: I have a Kindle. What apps can I use?

A: Any of the three work on a Kindle Fire Tablet by downloading the apps. But only Libby allows you to check out library books to your black and white kindle reader. It is pretty easy, though, so if you haven't tried it you should.

Q: Why are some of the books in this series missing?

A: Most books we buy disappear, or need to be repurchased, after 12-24 months. We do this for the more popular series, but often the price is too high if the series isn't getting checked out often. Let us know if you think we are missing something important!

Q: I want to read an eBook/audiobook that isn't available on any of the apps. Can you purchase a copy for me?

A: We happily take recommendations for digital purchases. We have the most control over our Libby collection, so that is where we buy them. Not all recommendations are purchased due to the price and likely demand, but we consider every title you request.

Q: I downloaded one of the apps, but I don't know how to use it. Can you help me?

A: Absolutely. We'll help you set up your library card, show you how to find good books and how to download them. I recommend you use our Book-a-Librarian service, to arrange a free 30-minute session with one of our staff. Just call or go to mahometpubliclibrary.org/bookalibrarian/ to set a time.


BECCA'S PICK: THE FIRST DAY OF SPRING




LEAH'S PICK: FOSTERED
