
2. LEARNING, CREATING, GROWING




KATHY'S PICK: THE BOOK OF NATURE


Numbers Back to Pre-COVID Totals

Like a lot of libraries, our usage went down during the COVID pandemic. I am happy to say that as of the fiscal year ending in June 2024, we have officially gotten back to pre-pandemic levels, and are continuing to grow from there. As of the end of the last year, we circulated 12.5 items for every person (adults and children) in our district.

In a society where we have smartphones, Netflix, TikTok and hundreds of other choices to distract and entertain us, reading is still going strong! It may look different, or sound different (audiobooks are having a moment!) but reading is not dead.


AERA'S PICK: CARRY ON


