

THE FUTURE EXCITEMENT BUILDS AS WE MOVE FOWARD WITH THE LIBRARY EXPANSION EXCITEMENT THEPRESENT

Children and their families find a special, magical area to stretch their imagination, read, learn and play. Adults and students looking for a quiet place conducive to study and work feel welcome and productive. Groups of all sizes have room to meet and connect. Members of the community sit outside in the shade, get lunch from a food truck, or come out to hear informal live music concerts. The collection has room to grow, as do the people using the Library.

The numbers of people visiting the Mahomet Library grow each year. In 2024-25, we averaged 219 people

per day through our doors. Increasingly, we find it harder and harder to provide spaces that work for all. Our most popular programs overwhelm our program room and spill out into the halls. Built as one room, children enjoying the library make it hard for adults to read, work and study. The schedule for our program/meeting room is packed, and too often we must turn away groups looking for a place to meet.

We started planning an expansion as in 2021, and as we approach the end of 2025, we believe the time to make it happen has come.

EXPANSION PLAN - WHAT IS INCLUDED?

The plan calls for 4 phases. To save money, we plan to move forward with Phases 1-3 all at one time. Phase 4 will happen in the future, as funding allows.

- Phase 1: New Children's Library with Teen Room
 Set off from the rest of the Library in its own wing,
 this space will serve families and students of all
 ages and offer plentiful room for imaginative play,
 as well as broader collections. Teens will have a
 space to call their own.
- Phase 2: Expanded, Dividable Program/Meeting Room This multipurpose room will be nearly twice as large as our existing program room to accommodate our most popular programs. It can be divided into two to offer more options for community groups to meet.
- Phase 3: Covered Patio/Outdoor Program Space
 This shaded space will offer opportunities to enjoy
 the outdoors and live music, host programs, and
 more. It will provide another location for our most
 popular programs that allows us to accommodate
 larger crowds.
- Phase 4: Extended Shelving and Study Rooms (Future Plan) Though it's not included in our current expansion, this phase is part of our longterm plan. Seven 1-2 person study rooms will bracket a large extension of our adult collections.

EXPECTED COST AND FUNDING

Our architect is completing new estimates as this goes to press, but the most recent estimates was in the range of \$7.5 million. Funding will come from a combination of Library reserves, private fundraising, State Grant (currently estimated at \$125,000), and bonds issued via a referendum. While we will have to ask taxpayers to cover part of the cost, we are exploring every other possibility to find funds for this project in hopes that our request in March will be as modest as possible.

HOW WILL THE COMMUNITY BENEFIT?

- Space for larger book collections, especially for children and teens
- New Children's Library wing will offer more materials and activities for children and families, and foster opportunities to meet/make friends
- Program/meeting room will offer more spaces for community organizations to meet, and handle large crowds for family programs with less overcrowding
- Covered pavilion/outdoor programming space will provide a shaded area for outdoor programs and another beautiful space to read or study
- Existing library will be quieter and more conducive to studying, reading, and working
- New books and materials will be displayed more prominently and be easier to find.
- The Edgar Room will become a multi-purpose community room for informal meeting, socializing, and other social activities.

SUPER SUMMER

Before we say goodbye to summer, lets recognize what a great summer we had.

866 students ages 0-16 signed up for summer reading this year – I'm pretty sure that's a new record. We recorded nearly a quarter of a million(!) minutes of reading. We offered 75 programs that were attended by 5,103 people. I couldn't be prouder of our library staff – no one works harder than they do.


COMMUNITY SURVEY

Nearly 500 adults, 69 teens, and 108 youth filled out our surveys. Thank you! As you can see at left, 92% rated us Very Good or Excellent, but they also offered hundreds of comments and suggestions to make us better. Rest assured, we have read every one of these, and will use that information in our planning. We can't make everyone happy, but we've gotten lots of ideas to help us be better every day.

Of course, more than anything else, this fall we will be working on our long-needed library expansion – centered around a magical new children's library. As you see in the planned floor plan, this expanded children's area will be over twice the size of our current children's area! After waiting four years for a promised state grant (we qualify every year only to be told the program hasn't been funded), the Board of Trustees is moving ahead without it. If you see me, ask me more about it. But only if you have time - I am psyched to make this possible and I love to talk about it.
